# Pastors Report for 2008 Annual Meeting

It's hard to believe that I'm now in my second year as your pastor.

Since my arrival in September of 2006, I have been very busy between my activities here at Auburn Church, WRA Lay School, Geauga Co-op, Chagrin Valley Council of Churches and the Western Reserve Association where I am now the Moderator.

The year 2007 was a busy year for all of us. Between the church dinners and the regular morning worship services, I especially enjoyed the September cookout ("smoke out" for me") and all of the events that we engage in.

Thanks to all who make the church dinners a success. I am amazed at how you make it look so easy.

In 2007 I performed six funerals, two baptisms and one wedding.

I look forward to starting Bible Study again sometime after Lent and hope to prepare a "Healing Service" to also begin after Lent. The healing service will be a once a month event.

I am especially pleased at the numbers of children that attend Sunday Service and then Sunday

School. I am also especially pleased at the members who faithfully attend church each Sunday.

We averaged 46 worshipers each Sunday during 2007. On this past Christmas Eve, we counted 94 people who attended our Christmas Eve Service. I understand this might have been a record number. Thanks for your efforts in our "Each One Bring One" campaign.

As you all might remember, Easter sunrise service was snowed out last year. This year Easter is on March 23rd; let's pray that we don't get snow this year and are able to have our sunrise service as planned.

Our Music Ministry has continued to be a "standout" under the direction of Bob Boles and thanks to Stephanie Boles for providing the hymns and anthems for us each Sunday. The choir has been splendid.

December was a busy month. Starting with the First Sunday in Advent and the lighting of the Advent candles to the last Sunday in December; New Years Eve.

And finally, our mission trip to Back Bay Mission was a success

in more ways than one (smile). We were able to continue the process of providing shelter to families in Biloxi, Mississippi and had an opportunity to get to know members of other churches in the Geauga Cooperative.

This year has been a spirit filled experience and I pray that you have been satisfied with our progress. I look forward to implementing new plans in 2008 and growing our congregation by a few more members.

I'd like to thank all of the members of this congregation who put in so much time to make 2007 a successful year.

Thank you for your music, your food, your support of our ministry, the commitment to attending church each Sunday and for your enthusiasm and dedication to serve has been exciting to watch. I thank you from the bottom of my heart and pray for you always.

I have had a wonderful 12 months being with you and I look forward to a blessed 2008.
